Mr. Metcalf was born June 27, 1935, to Harold E. and Dorothy (Mousel) Metcalf in McCook. He was raised on the Metcalf Ranch in Decatur County, home-stayed by his grandparents. He graduated from Decatur Community High School in 1953, and attended Fort Hays State University.

He served in the United States Army from January 1955 to January 1958.

In June of 1955, he married Ann Greer of Great Bend. After his father died in 1959, he and his family lived on the ranch.

On June 7, 1976, he married Karen (Anderson) Richards in Wichita. His family grew to include four stepchildren.

Mr. Metcalf was active in the Oberlin community. He was a partner in the Oberlin Insurance Agency/Decatur County Abstract and later owned and operated Metcalf Realty. He was a member of the United Methodist Church and served as a lay leader and as a chairman of the church board. He belonged to the Masonic Lodge, American Legion Post No. 70, and Rotary.
