

# Logan's Lady Trojans fall short in game against Stockton

The Logan Lady Trojan basketball team fell to 6-9 on the season after losing at home to the Stockton Tigers, 53-47 on Jan. 31.

Stockton had the lead at the end of the first quarter 14-12 and 29-27 at half. In that second quarter, however, both teams scored 15 points.

The third quarter found Logan on top 38-35, but then the roof fell in as the visiting Tigers turned up the heat and, in the process, scored 18 points vs. 9 for the Trojans to capture the victory.

Scoring for Logan were: Jenny Noel 16; Anne Hartman 11; Brumbaugh 9; Kemper 7; and Clements 4. For Stockton, it was Kayla Damrow with 19; Savannah Lowry 15; Berkley 9; Campbell 5; Nelson 3; and Kriley 2.

Logan was 40 percent from the floor, connecting on 19 of 48, while Stockton was 37 percent, connecting on 19 of 52.

The Trojans pulled down 23 rebounds with Hartman grabbing 10

and Noel 5. Logan stole the ball 15 times with Clements getting 5 and Noel 4. The Trojans dished out 16 assists with Brumbaugh issuing 7 and Kemper 5. In the blocked shots category, Kemper stopped one. Total Trojan turnovers were 24.

Logan's shooting percentages showed Kemper 2 of 7 for 29 percent; Clements 2 of 4 for 50 percent; Hartman 5 of 15 for 33 percent; Noel 7 of 13 for 54 percent; and Brumbaugh 3 of 6 for 50 percent.

"We were out-rebounded and out-hustled tonight," said coach Linda Nighswonger. "We did not take very good care of the ball...and we had way too many unforced errors."

"Our shots were rimming out and rolling off the rim and we eventually became frustrated."

"We fought hard to the end. We needed to catch a break or two during the game, but it just didn't happen," the coach said.

# Logan boys defeated by Kensington Friday

## Two Norton coaches reach milestone in same season!

Norton Community High School boys basketball coach Doug Reusink was honored prior to the game with Smith Center here on Tuesday evening for coaching his 400th victory.

The 400th milestone came when Norton rallied from a 17-point deficit to defeat Hill City 37-33 in the Mid-Continent League Tournament opener here on January 17.

Bruce Poage, the "Voice of the Blue Jays", called attention of the large crowd to the center of the court where Norton Community High School Athletic Director Larry Mills presented a basketball autographed by members of this year's team along with 400 golf tees to Coach Reusink.

"This year's team members know Coach Doug loves coaching basketball but they also know he likes to play golf so they want him to have a tee for every victory," said Poage.

"While coaching at Northern Valley, Coach Reusink had a record of 214 wins and 46 losses, while at Norton, he has had 188 wins and 130 losses. His career victories include state championships at Northern Valley in 1986, 1990 and 1991 and in 2003 in Norton.

"And, how special it is that Norton Community

High School has two varsity basketball coaches who have reached the 400 victory milestone in the same season."

Norton girls coach Kevin Jilka reached the 400 victory milestone on December 9 when his Lady Jays defeated Burlington, Colo. in the Topside Tipoff Tournament in Goodland. # Former Norton trackster competing at Fort Hays

Jared Sloan is competing in track for Fort Hays State University in Hays.

Sloan, a former prep star for Norton Community High School, is a sophomore for indoor track this season and will be a freshman for outdoor track. He redshirted the 2005 outdoor season due to knee surgery.

Sloan opened the indoor season last weekend in the Charlie Foster Classic in Kearney. He placed second in the 55-meter hurdles in 7.83 seconds and third in the high jump by clearing 6-foot-3-inches.

In the 2005 indoor season, Sloan placed second in the high jump and third in the 55-meter hurdles in the Fort Hays Open, third in the hurdles and fifth in the high jump in the All-Comers Meet in Kearney and fourth in the heptathlon, fifth in the 60-meter hurdles and sixth in the high jump in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Championships.

Fort Hays Head Coach Dennis Weber has indicated that Sloan will also compete in the decathlon this year.

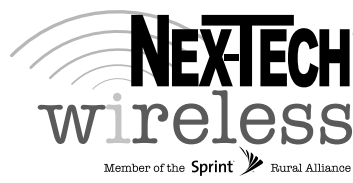
