Slow first half ends with loss for Norton boys basketball

Coach Doug Reusink knew Hill City would be seeking revenge after his Norton Community High School boys basketball team rallied from a 17-point deficit to beat them in the first round of the Mid-Continent League Tournament earlier this year in Norton and the Ringnecks got that revenge with a 41-33 league win in Hill City on Friday night.

Just as they did in the first meeting, the Blue Jays fell behind in the first half. Hill City led 12-8 after one quarter and 22-10 at halftime. When the second half began, Norton slowly cut into the Hill City lead as they outscored the Ringnecks 14-6 in the third period to trail by just 28-24 heading into the crucial fourth stanza.

Unlike in Norton, the rally fizzled in the final quarter. The Ringnecks paraded to the free throw line and outscored the Blue Jays 13-9 to record the eight-point win.

Hill City hit just one field goal in the fourth quarter but swished 11 of 12 free throw attempts! For the game, the Ringnecks hit 13 of 19 charities as Norton committed 15 fouls. There was a huge discrepancy in the foul department. Hill City had only four fouls the entire game and Norton went to the free throw line only once!

Both teams hit 14 field goals but Norton scored more points from the field because of four baskets from beyond the arc compared to none for the home team.

"Despite the difference in fouls, fouls didn't beat us," said Coach Reusink.


