In a repeat performance, Coach Doug Reusink's Norton Community High School boys basketball team defeated Oberlin 56-37 on Tuesday evening in Oberlin.

The Blue Jays beat the Red Devils 59-24 in Norton on January 3.

This time, the score was a little closer because Oberlin shot a little better and Norton not quite as well. Just as in the previous meeting, however, the Blue Jays dominated the backboards.

"We didn't play with a lot of inplayed better than the first time we played them," said Coach Reusink.
