Relay For Life is a unique fund raising event in which teams of participants take turns walking or running the track for 12 hours in an effort to fight cancer. The Relay for Norton County will be held in August, and a meeting on March 2 at 6 p.m. at the Town & Country Restaurant will finalize the date.

Melba Witt, spokesperson for the local organization, urges anyone interested in helping to please attend the meeting. "We can always use more volunteers," she said this morning.

Several committees are already at work planning the event.

According to information provided *The Telegram*, the message of Relay for Life is that cancer can be conquered. "This theme of hope is ignited as the ceremony begins with a cancer survivors' lap. This emotional lap honors the courage of all who have defeated cancer. Each survivor is introduced, and then all will walk, run, or wheelchair the opening lap unified in victory and in hope," the American Cancer Society said.

It continues, "The atmosphere of Relay For Life is one of camaraderie and celebration, providing an opportunity for cancer survivors to pass the torch of hope on to those still battling cancer or those that might be touched by cancer in the future.




