Highway 36 schools produce many outstanding wrestlers

When it comes to state high need look no further than U.S. 36, which runs east to west across the northern tier of counties.

Schools along the road produced 31 wrestlers with at least a sixth-place finish out of the 84 possible places, 44 percent of the winning places at the Class 3-2-1A state tournament at Hays on Sat-

From St. Francis in the west as far east as Sabetha, just a few miles north of 36 on U.S. 75, the "Route of the Windmills" has developed into a vein of wrestling tradition.

That's 324 miles out of the 391 from the Colorado state line to Missouri, just 83 percent of the road producing all those state champion high school wrestlers, said Fred Holthaus at the Kansas Department of Transportation.

The 2006 champions came from Norton, St. Francis, Atwood, Oberlin, Phillipsburg, Smith Center, Belleville and Sabetha.

Norton won the Class 3-2-1A year, a first for the Blue Jays. And Matt Migchelbrink, Atwood, Wilger, St. Francis, second.






