

Small schools beat big schools in Kansas Wrestling Senior Classic

Led by three Norton Community High School state champions, the Small Schools beat the Big Schools 41-31 in the annual Kansas Wrestling-Senior Classic 2006 dual on Sunday in the high school in Abilene.

The Senior Classic is sponsored by the Kansas Wrestling Coaches Association and the USA Wrestling-Kansas.

The top Kansas senior wrestlers were invited to compete. Wrestlers from Class 3-2-1A and 4A were on the Small Schools Team and the Class 5A and 6A wrestlers were on the Big Schools Team.

Clay Madden, Luke Pfannenstiel and Lance Roe appeared to still be in good physical condition since winning state championships this year and all three were impressive in winning their matches.

Madden, the only four-time state champion in Norton history, wrestled Kenneth Livengood, Blue Valley North, this year's Class 6A state champion, in the 119 pound match. Livengood has the state's career wins record with 166 but Madden decided him 5-3. Madden was 39-1 this season and 128-10 overall in his prep career.

At 152 pounds, Pfannenstiel wrestled David Loos, Bishop Carroll, the Class 5A state champion. It was a re-match from the Newton Tournament of Champions where Loos edged Pfannenstiel 7-5 for the gold medal. This time around was a different story as Pfannenstiel defeated Loos 9-6 to avenge the earlier loss. Pfannenstiel compiled a 33-6 record this season and was 91-24 in four years of wrestling for Norton Community High School.

Roe is a two-time state champion for the Blue Jays. He wrestled three-time Class 5A state champion Frank Jonas, Kapaun, in the 160 pound match. It was no con-

Smith Center's state champion Travis Warner decided fourth place state finisher in Class 6A Matt Mahan, Shawnee Mission South, 9-5.

Chris Sutton-Kearn, Concordia's Class 4A state champion at 189 pounds, decided Lawrence Free State's Jesse Hardy, 6-4.

test as Roe dominated Jonas in winning a 17-6 major decision. Roe had a 37-1 record this season and was 136-20 overall.

After Roe's big win, the Small Schools had a 29-18 advantage with six matches to go.

Salina South's Nick Nothorn gave the Big Schools an early 9-7 edge with a 3-1 double overtime win over Abilene's Tanner Dawson in the 125 pound match. Nothorn edged junior Nathan Broeckelman, Norton's other state champion, by a 4-3 score in Newton's Tournament of Champions. It was one of only two season losses for Broeckelman who finished the season 40-2.

Nash Burtin, Eureka senior and two-time state champion, wrestled at 112 pounds. He rolled to a 10-2 decision over Donte Rogers, Wichita Northwest, who was third in the state in Class 6A. Burtin, who finished the season with a perfect 36-0 record, edged Norton freshman Zach Bainter 16-15 to win the Class 3-2-1A state championship.

Two Colby wrestlers won matches for the Small Schools. At 140 pounds, two-time Class 4A state champion Cole Garcia decided Class 6A state champion Brett Hoshaw, Manhattan, 7-5. In one of two 145 pound matches, the Eagles' Class 4A state runnerup Taylor Finley decided Class 5A fifth place finisher Ryan McKoon, Paola, 9-3.

Other results of area wrestlers were: 130 - Tait Weatherbee, Class 4A state champion who was 25-0 this season, was pinned in 1:39 by four-time Class 5A state champion Tristen Deshazer, Wichita West; 135 - Logan Dreiling, Scott City, the Class 4A state champion, lost a 6-2 decision to Chase Moses, Goddard; 171 - James Wright, Beloit, the Class 3-2-1A state champion, was pinned in 2:14 by Bryan Irsik, Garden City, state runnerup in Class 6A; 215 - Tim Erwin, Hoxie, third place state finisher, lost a 3-1 decision to Justin Naccarato, Valley Center, the Class 5A state champion.

Bill Johnson, coach of Norton's three-in-a-row state champion team, was head coach of the Small Schools. "These all-star competitions are kind of neat," he said. "There is no pressure, so the young men can just come in and wrestle. Whether they win or lose, it doesn't really matter here. This is for the fun of the sport and to go out on a good note."

Coach Johnson was pleased with how all three of his Norton wrestlers performed. "I knew all three had really tough matches," he said. "Loos had beaten us earlier in the year and Roe had never wrestled Jonas, who was a four-time state finalist and three-time champion.

"Roe just dominated him. I was impressed and I am sure everyone else was."
