# Norton track team to open 2006 season on Monday

Coach Bruce Graber's Norton Community High School track team will open its 2006 season on Monday in the Junior Varsity Track Meet in Smith Center.

Competition will begin at 4:30 p.m. with the field events and the 3200 meter run. Other running events will begin at 5 p.m. There will be no running preliminaries.

The Norton varsity track tream will open the season on Friday, April 7 with the annual Norton Invitational Track Meet on the Jep Byrum Track at Travis Field.


