## PUBLIC NOTICES Almena City Ordinance **Regulating Sound Systems**

Published in The Norton Telegram on Friday, April 7 and 14. (2T)

**ORDINANCE NO. 403** ORDINANCE REGULATING AN THE USE OF SOUND AMPLIFICA-TION SYSTEMS IN MOTOR VEHICLES WITHIN THE CITY OF ALMENA, KANSAS

WHEREAS, the governing body of the City of Almena, Kansas, finds that the use of loud sound amplification systems in motor vehicles within the City constitutes a general nuisance to the public and should be prohibited;

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ALMENA, KANSAS:

Section One. Article 2 of Chapter XI of the Code of the City of Almena, Kansas, is hereby amended by adding the following section

"11-201 LOUD AMPLIFICATION SYSTEMS PROHIBITED:

a. No person operating or occupying a motor vehicles on a street, highway, alley, parking lot or driveway shall operate or permit the operation of any sound amplification system from within the vehicle so that the sound is plainly audible at a distance of 50 or more feet from the vehicle:

c. Plainly audible means: any sound

vehicle may be stopped, standing,

amplification of sound;

parked or moving on a street, highway, alley, parking lot or driveway.

d. It is an affirmative defense to a charge under this section that the operator was not otherwise prohibited by law from operating a sound amplification system, and that any of the following apply:

1. The system was being operated to request medical or vehicular assistance or to warn of a hazardous road condition;

The vehicle was an emergency or public safety vehicle:

3. The vehicle was owned and operated by the City of Almena, Kansas, or a gas, electric, communications or refuse company;

4. The system was used for the purpose of giving instructions, directions, talks, addresses, lectures or transmitting music to any persons or assemblages of persons in compliance with ordinances of the City of Almena. Kansas;

5. The vehicle was used in an authorized public activity, such as a parade, fireworks display, sporting event, musical production or other activity, which has the approval of the department of the City authorized to grant such approval.
