Since coming to Kansas he has discovered that his favorite is cherry wine. He said he has made

some nice pear wine, too. He started his hobby from the ground up, even making his own crusher. He told the club about the help he had from local craftsmen. Jerry Bantam helped with some of the mechanisms, Ed Witt helped build part of the grinding device and Bud Posson helped with the metal "teeth" of the crusher.

Mr. Carlson demonstrated how efficient the grinder is and also how he corks and uncorks a bottle.

He labels his wine with the flavor and the year it was made.

He shared a tip to judge the alcohol content of a wine. The liquid should be swirled in the glass. It will leave lines, called "legs". The more legs, the higher the alcohol content.


