Matthew 5:43-48

You have heard that it was said, "Love your neighbor and hate your enemy." But I tell you: Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be sons of your Father in heaven. He causes His sun to rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous. If you love those who love you, what reward will you get? Are not even the tax collectors doing that? And if you greet only your

brothers, what are you doing more than others? Do not even pagans do that? Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect."

Do you have enemies? I certainly don't seek them out.

These past few weeks I've been studying Jesus' Sermon on the Mount, and as I came upon this passage I reflected on various times in my life when I have had real, identifiable enemies.

What is an enemy? Merriam-Webster's 10th edition says "one that is antagonistic to another; especially: one seeking to injure, overthrow, or confound an oppo-

Ever had one of those? I have, and it's no fun. I tend not to like people who are antagonistic towards me. Or people who seek to injure me, or put me down, or turn others against me.

And Jesus says I'm supposed to love them and pray for them.


