Irene Wilma Wagoner, 98, formerly of Lenora, died Wednesday at the Good Samaritan Home in Oberlin.

Born Oct. 21, 1907, in a sod house seven miles northwest of Hill City, she was the daughter of William and Gertrude (Hutton) Hardman.

She graduated from Lenora grade school and from Lenora High School with a Normal Training Certificate for teaching grade school. She taught school in the Zohner Country School, the North Star School and Chapman Hill School near Logan.

On May 11, 1928, she married Floyd Wagoner and lived on the former Edwards Wagoner Farm in Indiana Township for 15 years before they bought a farm three miles north of Lenora in 1943. In 1951, the Wagoners bought the Lenora Drug Store and sold it in 1965 due to his health. After Mr. Wagoner's death in 1967, she moved to Norton. She worked at Browne's Clothing Store and other businesses. She retired at the age of 70.

Following her retirement, she toured extensively during the 70s and 80s in most all states, five countries of Europe, and all of Canada. She moved to the Good Samaritan Home in Oberlin in May 2004.

She was a member of the Congregational Church now known as the United Parish in Lenora, where she was very active, espe-

cially with the youth fellowship group. She was a leader of 4-H groups in both sewing and cooking. She was a member of the Order of Eastern Star Chapter 296, the Federated Women's Club, Portia Club, president for many years of Norton China Painting Club, and she enjoyed making quilts and handy work projects, and she had a big collection of antiques. She loved working in her yard and had a big garden until 2002.

Norton Lions Club met last Tuesday at the American Legion with Toby Kuhn, Assistant Police Chief, as the guest speaker.

Officer Kuhn represented the Chaston VanDerVeen Memorial Bicycle Safety Program. He is the uncle of the 6-year old boy who was killed a little over two years ago after he failed to stop his bicycle at a stop sign and was hit by a semi-tractor/trailer. He was not wearing a helmet, either.

Officer Kuhn has been instrumental in developing the safety program and bringing it to area schools. He said, "Through tragedy came a giant out-pouring of support."

The bicycle safety program targets kindergarten children, first and second graders. One of the

things the program tries to do is provide safety helmets to the children attending the bicycle rodeos held at schools in Phillipsburg, Alma, Norton, Logan, Lenora and Hill City.

Officer Kuhn said the program needs volunteers to help with registration, safety inspections and safety instructions.
