Sometimes life really does imitate art; at least that's been the case for Louise Serpa, an award-winning rodeo photographer. Like the cowboys who climb atop those wild creatures, she has been daring both personally and profes-

Most notably, in 1963 Serpa questions about his "Horse Gear". became the first woman allowed to photograph inside a professional rodeo arena. She was also the first woman photographer allowed on the course of the Grand National Steeplechase in England. In 1982, the Pro Rodeo Cowboys Association recognized her for the Best Action Photo. Then in 1994, Serpa published her book "Rodeo: No Guts, No Glory", a collection of extraordinary images, some of which have hung in galleries across the country.

Most recently, she earned the Tad Lucas Memorial Award for outstanding work in the sport of rodeo, as well as inductions into
