Summer heat can kill unnecessarily. Soaring daytime temperatures, especially if accompanied by high humidity, greatly increase the risk of heat exhaustion and heat

Heat exhaustion is typically caused by the body's inability to sweat enough to cool itself. Signs of heat exhaustion include heavy sweating, fatigue, weakness, dehydration (thirst), paleness, and feeling dizzy or light-headed.

As the body's cooling system fails, the risk of heat stroke increases. Symptoms of heat stroke can include hot, dry skin that may be flushed, but is not sweaty. Other signs are a rapid heart rate, headache, dizziness, nausea, confusion, loss of consciousness and high body temperature (103-105 degrees).

Heat stroke can cause permanent physical impairments or death. If it's suspected, seeking immediate medical treatment is the best course.
