Who is this?, By Pastor Rick Rostek, Immanuel Lutheran Church

In the book of Mark, we're told of the time when Jesus and the disciples were in a boat on the Sea of Galilee. Suddenly, a strong storm came up and nearly swamped the boat. Amazingly, Jesus was sleeping through all of this, but the disciples quickly woke him, fearful for their lives. Getting up, Jesus called out to the storm, "Quiet! Be still!" With that, the wind died down and the sea became calm, but the disciples were more afraid than ever. "Who is this? Even the wind and the waves obey him!" they said. For the disciples, this episode was not the end of their storms, but the beginning of their faith in the One who would reveal himself as God in the flesh. In the Old Testament, God describes Himself to Job as the One who says to the sea, "This far you may come and no farther; here is where your proud waves halt." Jesus does just

that, halting the proud waves of the Sea of Galilee, and revealing Himself to be God. And through other miracles, Jesus showed that

He was pushing back the reign of Satan on earth and making way for the reign of God. Satan thought that he had the victory when Jesus

died on the cross, but Jesus proved Satan wrong when He rose from the dead on that first Easter. Now Jesus, God in the flesh, invites all people to come to that cross where there is forgiveness of sins and everlasting life.

The storms in life did not end for the disciples on that stormy night. In fact, many of them would suffer mockings, beatings, and even imprisonment. But they continued to preach the Gospel of Jesus Christ because they knew that nothing on this earth could separate them from the love of God in Christ Jesus. The disciples call on us to believe the very same thing. Through faith in Jesus, we have the confidence that He will see us through the storms of life, even death, to life everlasting. He is faithful to the promise He made, "Whoever believes in me will live." Thus we know who this is. He is Jesus, God's Son, God Himself, who offers life to all who believe in Him.
