## Serenity Hope Porter

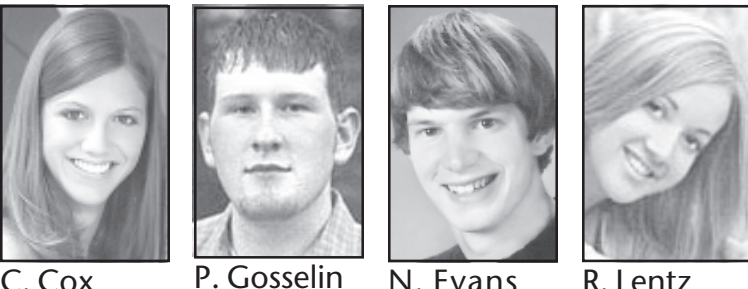
