"Our coaching staff welcomed 30 plus players on opening day and we have been pleased with their efforts so far in practice," said coach Zimmerman.

"We've had very good leadership from our four seniors. They have kept the teams moving through the drills while keeping players as focused as possible. "The thing about this group of
