In less than half an hour Sunday evening, Jennings received two inches of rain and small hail. We are always thankful for the moisture.

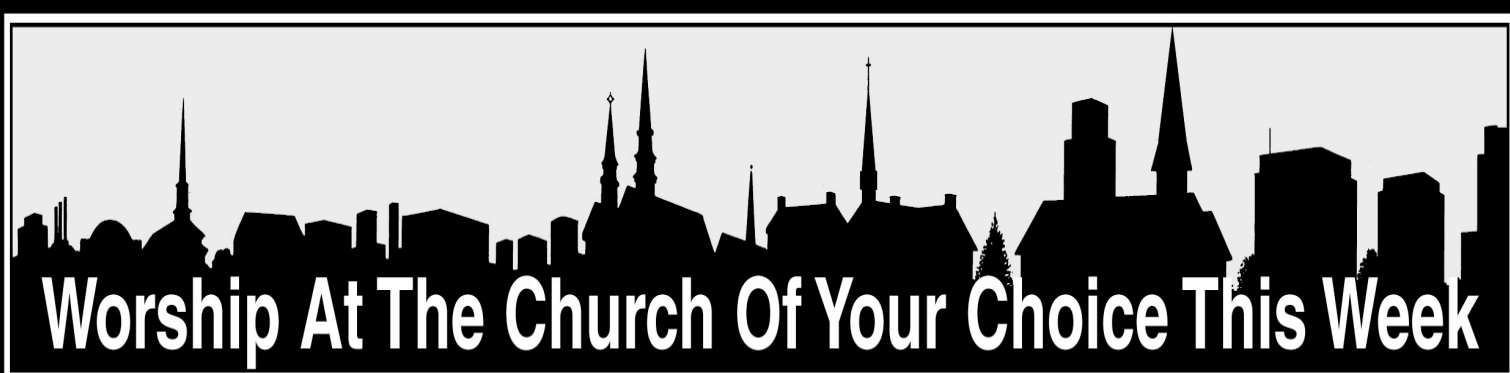
