Norton rings up a 'W' on road at Trego

The Norton Community High School football team earned their first victory under new head coach Lucas Melvin on Friday night in WaKeeney when they defeated Trego Community 27-6 in Mid-Continent League play.

In the opener last week, the Blue Jays lost 14-3 to two-time defending Class 2A state champion Smith Center when they made a super defensive effort to hold the Redmen to their lowest game point total in two years. The Norton offense was unable to put enough points on the board to take advantage of the defensive effort.

On Friday night in WaKeeney, the Norton offense showed up as well. The Blue Jays gained 157 yards rushing on 36 attempts for a 4.4 yards per carry average. They also gained 100 yards through the air to finish with 257 yards of to-

The gang-tackling Norton defense was also equal to the occasion as they limited the Golden Eagles to 28 yards rushing on 41 attempts for a .7 yard per carry average and 62 yards passing for 90 total yards.

For the second straight week, the Blue Jays had no fumbles. They had six penalties for 40 yards but most of the penalty yardage came from two pass interference calls against the aggressive Norton defense.

Norton's senior tailback Blake VanEaton started the Blue Jays' scoring with a beautiful 28-yard touchdown run with 9:31 left in the first quarter. Senior fullback and kicker Chris Davis booted the extra point to make it 7-0. A 41 yard touchdown run by VanEaton later in the quarter was not allowed due to a blocking in the back penalty on the Jays.

A bad punt snap by Trego went out of the end zone in the second quarter to give Norton a safety and 9-0 halftime advantage.

After junior tailback Todd Bolt returned a Trego punt to their 15yard line, junior quarterback Logan Kats passed to junior wide receiver Wes Georgeson in the corner of the end zone to give Norton a 15-0 lead with 7:51 left in the period.

After another bad punt snap by Trego, Norton got the ball on the Golden Eagles' 9-yard line and Kats hit sophomore tight end Zac Dreher in the end zone with 3:04 left in the game.

Coach Melvin was happy to get his first win as head coach of the Blue Jay gridders after being an assistant under coach Bruce Graber, who took over the head grid job at El Dorado after 11 seasons guiding Norton.

Although happy with the win, coach Melvin was not 100 percent happy with his team's performance. "We didn't play as aggressive as a team as we did against Smith Center," he said. "Some of our players were as aggressive but not very many.

"We weren't as focused as last week. Maybe we overlooked them or just had an emotional let down after last week.

"They didn't have a very good punt game but we didn't always take advantage of that. That one time in the red zone after one of their bad punt snaps, we had four downs to score from their one yard line and didn't."

Norton came very close to keeping Trego out of the end zone. "When they scored on a fourth down pass, we had a break in coverage or they wouldn't have scored," said coach Melvin.

"Offensively, they blitzed us a lot and we didn't handle that as well as we should have.

"We can play a lot better. I'm happy we won but I'm not satisfied with the way we played."

Coach Melvin said his team came out of the game without any major injuries. Fullback Chris Davis left the game with a leg problem but it didn't appear to be serious. "Matt Stanley replaced

coach Melvin.


