The Norton Junior High School football team beat Phillipsburg 32-6 on Sept. 7.

Terrell Lane brought in Norton's first six points when he rushed 44 yards to score in the first quarter. His point-after attempt fell short.

In the second quarter, Lane was in the end zone two more times. He caught a 21-yard pass from Spencer Shirk, and then tacked on two more points when he caught another pass. Lane then broke into the end zone from 3 yards out. No extra points were made.

Phillipsburg made its only six points in the second quarter.

In the third quarter, Lane rushed 40-yards to score. Then, he rushed another 40-yards for the final six points. No points after were made in the fourth.

"Our line did a great job tonight," said coach George Rossi. "Kaid McKenna, Landon Keiswetter, Justin Griffith, Luke Ninemire, Andrew Otter and

Rylee Stanley did a great job of moving Phillipsburg off the line.

"The backs ran the ball hard. Conditioning came into account again in the second quarter, but the boys fought through it in the second half and over-powered the Panthers.

"Phillipsburg has a good team and did not give up at any time."

Lane led rushing with 163 yards on 10 carries, followed by Troy Bainter, 38 on 7; Kaid McKenna, 24 on 7; Shirk, 21 on 6; and Bill Broeckelman, 14 on 4.

Shirk completed 3 of 5 passes for 76 yards. Lane received all three passes.

Tackle leaders were Lane, 6 solos, 2 assists; Caleb Laughlin, 4 solos; Landon Keiswetter, 1 solo, 5 assists; McKenna, 3 solos, 6 assists; Shirk, 1 solo, 3 assists; and Luke Ninemire, 1 solo, 3 assists.

The junior varsity tied 8-8 with Phillipsburg in two quarters. Tye Nickell made the Junior

Jays' touchdown in the first with Jordan Wahlmeier running in the extra points.

Phillipsburg's touchdown came in the second quarter.

"Due to low numbers for Phillipsburg, the game was only two quarters," said coach Rossi. "The Blue Jays started strong, scoring on their first drive. After that, I felt we let up and did not play as hard as we could.

"We gave up some big plays on defense because we did not attack the ball. We will play a full game against the Panthers in a couple of weeks and I hope the boys will play hard every play."

Nickell led rushing with 32 yards on 8 carries. He was followed by Wahlmeier, 21 on 3; Trey Millan, 18 on 4; and Seth Antrim, 7 on 1.
