Beloit Trojans become Norton's 6th victim

Coach Lucas Melvin's Norton Community High School football team opened district play Friday night with an impressive 28-8 victory over Beloit at Travis Field in Norton.

The win extended Norton's overall season record to 6-1 and dropped Beloit to 4-3.

In the other district game, Phillipsburg defeated Oberlin 47-12. Norton will host Phillipsburg this Friday at 7 p.m. and Oberlin will play at Beloit.

Norton had a good offensive night again as the Blue Jays gained 225 yards rushing and 105 passing for 330 total yards. Norton averaged 5.2 yards per carry rushing.

Meanwhile, the storming Blue Jay defense held the Trojans to 144 yards rushing and 89 passing for 233 total. Most importantly, Norton limited Beloit's outstanding senior running back Bradly Esterl to 96 yards rushing. He entered the game with 1,018 yards and an average of 170 yards per game. Esterl was averaging just over 10 yards per carry and the Blue Jays held him to a 5.6 yards average.

Norton's senior tailback Blake VanEaton had another 100 plus yards rushing night as he raced for 142 yards on 19 carries for a 7.5 yards per carry average. Blue Jay junior quarterback Logan Kats had one of his better games passing as he completed 8 of 11 aerials for all 105 of Norton's passing vards.

Norton kicked off to start the game but forced Beloit to punt. The Trojans kicked the ball out of bounds on the Blue Jay 3-yard line. Six plays later, the Blue Jays were in the end zone. The big play was a 67 yard dash by VanEaton. The extra point kick by Chris Davis was wide but Norton led 6-0 with 3:58 left in the first quarter.

Both teams exchanged punts twice before the Blue Jays put together a 66 yard, 10-play drive for their second touchdown. VanEaton scored from three yards out. Davis scored two extra points from his fullback spot and the Jays led 14-0 with 50 seconds left in the first half.

Norton took the opening kickoff of the second half and appeared to be driving for another touchdown. A fumble on the Beloit 1-yard line kept the Blue Jays out of the end found a nice hole over right tackle, touchdown of the night. Davis ran zone. Norton was on the Beloit 4 when the third quarter ended. VanEaton hit paydirt from two yards out with 11:26 left and the Jays led 22-0. After Davis' kickoff, the gangtackling Blue Jay defense stopped Beloit at midfield and drove for another touchdown. This time, quarterback Logan Kats passed one yard to tight end Jared Cox for the score. The extra point try was no good but the Blue Jays were on top 28-0 with just 2:23 remaining in the game. It was too little, too late for the Trojans when quarterback Kruse passed 55 yards to Esterl for their only touchdown with 1:24 left. A pass for two points made the final 28-8. Coach Melvin was happy overall with the way his Blue Jays played. "We played hard again," he said. "Our offense scored the first time we had the ball. At times our offense stalled a little but our offensive line blocked well again. "Our defense battled hard all night. We bent but didn't break. We missed some tackles on their long run that was called back.
