New director presents ideas for economic development

 on-the-job training program. School Superintendent Greg Mann said the students could attend a half-day job fair.
 Mr. Carter said he would also like to see if there was any way to get Telenet classes in Norton, which would improve the outreach program. He said he has talked to Colby Community College and the board suggested he talk with Goodland Vo-Tech and Fort Hays State University.
 In other business, the board:
 • Met new board member Brad Hopkins. Mr. Hopkins was appointed by the Almena City Council as its representative. His term lasts until May of 2008.
 • Discussed the Social and Rehabilitative Services (SRS) call

center. Norton has been approved as a potential location and SRS is waiting on proposals for the building of the center before making a decision. Mr. Carter will contact board member Donna Henderson to see what information she has gathered. He said he has some contacts in the SRS department that he can get in touch with.
 • Heard from Janis Monier, doctoral candidate with Kansas State University, that she did a pilot survey with 10 people to make sure it was understandable and confidential. She has since started to have people fill out the survey.
 Ms. Monier also gave the board a check for \$114. She said it was what they gave her for paper and ink costs. Her professors asked her to give the money back to make

sure the board wasn't influencing her or the survey in any way.
 • Learned from Mr. Miller that Orscheln's is still interested in Norton as a location for a store. He said the business is waiting for a proposal from the board about the building and three acres of land. Mr. Miller said a group of local businessmen are willing to build a building and then lease it to the company. However, they still need to get the land, which needs to be on U.S. 36.
 • Approved the purchase of a used desk for Mrs. Grysich for \$150 from Norton Furniture and a new chair for Mr. Carter for \$520 from End Zone.
 • Told Mr. Carter to get two or three bids for a computer for Mrs. Grysich.

City of Norton Snow Ordinances

The City of Norton wants to remind the public of our three snow ordinances. One requires the removal of snow and ice off public sidewalks within 24 hours after the fall of the snow or sleet. The second ordinance relates to removing parked vehicles from emergency snow routes. When the City of Norton publicly announces through the news media that an emergency snow condition exists, it is a violation to have any vehicle or trailer parked on a designated emergency snow route. The third ordinance makes it a violation for any person to pile or dump snow on any cleared street from a private driveway or sidewalk so as to constitute an impediment or hazard to normal traffic on the street. The city of Norton thanks everyone for their efforts in complying with these ordinances.
