

# Kansas organization holds art competition for students

TOPEKA — Kansas high school students are invited to participate in the second annual art competition hosted by the Native Sons and Daughters of Kansas. Works must be based upon the theme, "Kansas . . . As Beautiful As You Think!" and will be displayed at the organization's Kansas Day celebration banquet on Fri., Jan. 26, 2007 in Topeka.

Competition will be judged in the categories of painting, drawing, color and black and white photography and pastel. Winners of each category will each receive a \$100 scholarship and a \$300 scholarship will be awarded to the grand prize winner. Entrants do not need to be born in Kansas. Kansas Native Sons and Daughters is a nonpartisan

organization which celebrates Kansas and recognizes the Kansan of the Year and other distinguished Kansans. This forum offers the opportunity for Kansas students to be recognized as outstanding artists and for all who attend to revel in the state's beauty.

Photographs or scanned images of entries must be submitted as attachments to and e-mailed to [kansasjan29@yahoo.com](mailto:kansasjan29@yahoo.com) no later than 10 p.m. on Dec. 9, 2006. Finalists will receive electronic notification of the deadline to submit original works for final judging.

In 2005, preliminary entries were judged by Newton painter Phil Epp, Kansas City photographer Kevin Sink and Hays Arts Council executive Director Brenda Meder. In addition, Cindy Maude, president of the Callahan Creek, Inc. Advertising Agency, Lawrence and Liz Kowalchuk, assistant professor of the art edu-

cation program at the University of Kansas, served as judges of the finalist entries.

The grand prize winner was Christina Klein, Fairview, for her painting "Kansas Creek with Waterfall". The 2005 first place winners were Whitney Ransom, Easton, painting, "Kansas Horizons"; Jason Bruenn, Kansas City, drawing, "Flint Hills Afternoon"; Mindy Strecker, New Cambria, photograph, "All in a Hard Day's Work"; Nathan Williams-Detrixhe, Louisburg, three dimensional work, "Pewter Sunflower" and Amanda Sachse, Leavenworth, "other" category, "Rural Roots".
