# <u>PRAIRIE VIEW</u>

The Prairie View City Council met Jan. 8 at 7 p.m.. Gertrude Ericson submitted financial statements to the board for the month of December. Erma Jean Nyland voiced a concern about a water leak that occurred during the ice storm that dampened the back hall of the Community Center. There was a discussion about where the leak may be coming from and what actually caused it.

## **Ice Storm Clean Up**

Issues concerning the cleanup from the recent ice storm were discussed. Homeowners and the city have been pitching in cutting and hauling away the fallen branches. There is still a lot of work to be done which inmates from the Norton Correctional Facility will assist with. Any residents who wish to have their tree branches picked up are being advised to cut them into manageable pieces and place them in piles near the road. Since the inmates will be entering onto private property, a release form will be provided for each homeowner to sign before they attempt to remove the branches. This should take a few days during the week of Jan. 8 before 2:30 p.m. of each day. Mark Graham entered a motion for this project and Stanley Runnion seconded the motion. Concerns were expressed about existing hanging branches that have the possibility of falling during a strong wind. Stanley Runnion volunteered to help with the problem and will inquire about equipment. Larry Brown has to assist with removing the branches.

#### **Other Ice Storm Issues**

Board member Patty Tien expressed concern of a means of notifying local residents of the updates during the recent weather crisis. During this time residents had to rely on contacting the Community Center for information on the power outage and inquire when it would be restored. She suggested a system be put in place to alleviate the need for the residents to call as the only way to keep updated with the power restoration progress. During the ice storm some residents chose to leave their homes to stay in a motel or with relatives, while others chose to tough it out with no heat, supplementary heat and/or gas generators, but only a hand-

the residents. The cost of the additional usage of propane for heating the Community Center, for an extended period of time, during the ice storm was brought up. The feasibility of installing a back-up generator at the Community Center with possible grant monies was mentioned since the generator used during the ice storm had to be rustled up, installed and rented by the city. Additional man hours put in, total damages to surrounding areas, and road damage were taken into consideration for relief under FEMA.

#### Letter of Appreciation

Gloria DeWitt, resident of Prairie View, submitted a letter of appreciation to the city for the forethought to set a system in place that allowed for uninterrupted water and sewer service during the recent ice storm and power outage. This helped both the residents during the difficult time and also the city since water and sewer are necessary services to the community and source income for the city. Gloria DeWitt also gave thanks to the city for having her fallen branches removed from the area around her mailbox

#### Breakfast at the Community Center

During the month of December, 33 people were served breakfast at the Community Center. They served a pancake and sausage breakfast on Jan. 10 between the hours of 7 a.m. and 8:30 a.m. Each month, on the second Wednesday, the Community Center serves a breakfast during these hours. The cost is by donation. The Community Center also served a total of 255 meals during the ice storm and power outage with the help of the Red Cross and residents.

#### **December Council Meeting**

The December City Council meeting took place on Dec. 13. The Lions Club had their annual dinner at the Community Center on Dec. 11. On Dec. 16, Santa came to town and bags of candy were distributed to local residents. The leak was fixed in the water and sewer system and the road repaired. Two new meters were ordered for the city. A leak in the roof of the Post Office was also addressed. Bills were presented for approval and the meeting adjourned at 10 p.m.
