Former Norton wrestling greats honored

During ceremonies at the J.R. Durham Invitational Wrestling Tournament on Saturday in Norton, former Blue Jay state wrestling medal winners from 1947, 1957, 1967, 1977 and 1997 were honored.

Each honored wrestler received congratulations and a "Certificate of Wrestling Excellence" from former longtime Norton coach J.R. "Jake" Durham as well as a congratulatory handshake from Norton Athletic Director Larry Mills.

The 1947 team placed sixth in the state tournament and had four state placers. James Mulder of Fremont, Neb. was the only one present Saturday evening. He placed second at 103 pounds. Also honored from the team were: Bill Smith, third, 112, deceased; Edgar Taylor, third, 154; Don Hemphill, fourth, heavyweight.

The 1957 team had one state placer, Leon Weiser, Norton. He was second at 103 pounds.

The 1967 Blue Jay wrestling squad placed second in the state in Class A-B. They had seven medalists. Present to receive their award and congratulations were Pat Donovan, Norton, third at 145 pounds, and Ron Zwickle, Norton, fourth at heavyweight. Ron Tacha, Manhattan, was first at 154 pounds. His friend Dave Cuthbertson accepted for him. Wayne Thiele placed second at 133 pounds. Lynn Thiele accepted

for him. Other state medalists from the team who were not present were: Stan Ward, second, 103; Myron Lowry, second, 112; Quentin Horning, Wichita, first, 138. Coach Durham, who coached that team, accepted Horning's certificate.

The 1977 Norton wrestling team finished fourth in the state tournament and had four state placers. Tim Schulze, Norton, placed third at 145 and was the only member of the team present. Other state medal winners from 1977 were John Horesky, Hoxie, first, 167; Wayne Dillon, third, 185; Amos Donaldson, third, heavyweight.

The 1997 Blue Jay wrestling squad placed second in the state tournament in Class 3-2-1A and was coached by current head coach Bill Johnson. Five members of the team medaled. Four of the five were present to be honored. They were Kale Mann, who is currently assistant wrestling coach at Mill Valley, second, 145; Curtis Brown, Tulsa, first, 171; Josh Kellerman, Kansas City, first, 215; Jeff Boyle, first, heavyweight. Brent Brandyberry, who placed first at 103 was not present but his father, David Brandyberry, accepted for him.

This was the 42nd annual wrestling tournament held in Norton and the 10th annual Durham tournament. It was renamed nine years ago in honor of J.R. "Jake" Durham of Norton, the former

longtime wrestling coach in Norton.

Jake's honors include membership in the National Wrestling Hall of Fame and Kansas High School Wrestling Hall of Fame. Jake and

his wife, Ruth, still reside in Norton.

Coach Johnson began to recognize the "Norton Wrestling Tradition" during his first year here in 1992. Over the past 15 years, 265

state medalists have been honored.

Making the individual introductions to the crowd over the public address system was Bruce Poage, the former longtime "Voice of the Blue Jays."

Husky boys fall, 69-52

The Northern Valley Husky boys lost a 69-52 decision to Eastern Heights at Alma on Jan. 5, but had their first half offensive output matched their second half effort, it might have ended up as a "W."

But such are the swings of basketball.

In the first half, the Huskies managed 19 points vs. 33 for Eastern Heights. In the second half, however the Northern Valley basketball machine cranked out 33 points vs. Eastern Heights' 36.
