Blue Jay basketball boys crush Osborne 68-40

Coach Doug Reusink's Norton Community High School boys basketball team extended their season record to 5-1 with a solid 68-40 Mid-Continent League victory at Osborne on Friday night.

The Blue Jays dominated the Bulldogs in the first, third and fourth quarters and played them even in the second. Senior Jared Engelbert scored 16 points from the perimeter and senior Nic Lewis and junior Wes Georgeson added 16 and 19 points, respectively, in the paint.

"This was a good win for us on the road," said coach Reusink. "I thought we played well at

times but not very consistent, especially in the second quarter.

"It was good to see three boys in double figures scoring but our free throw shooting was terrible, which could cost us down the road in close games."

The Jays connected on 52 percent from the field but hit only 36 percent from the charity stripe.

With Engelbert, Lewis and Georgeson all finding the range, Norton took a 19-14 lead by the end of the first quarter. Norton was outscored 10-8 in the second quarter to make it a 27-24 game at halftime.
