Norton wrestlers win Panther Classic — again

Coach Bill Johnson's Norton Community High School wrestling team turned in another strong performance on Saturday to win the Panther Classic Tournament in Phillipsburg for the fourth year in

Norton amassed 197 points to outdistance second place Phillipsburg by 45.5 points. The Panthers totaled 151.5 points and were followed by Beloit, 144; St. Francis, 105; Hoisington, 95.5; Ellsworth, 46; Minneapolis, 42; Lincoln, 41; Stockton, 40; Ellis, 37; Hill City, 27; Lakin, 24; Hoxie,

The Blue Jays had nine wrestlers in the championship finals and four won championships. Two other Norton wrestlers placed third and one finished fourth out of the 14 who competed.

Champions for Norton were freshman Kaenon Keiswetter, 112; senior Nathan Broeckelman, 130; senior Kent Mann, 135 and junior Alex Thomas, 285.

Earning runnerup medals were freshman Connor Pfannenstiel, 103; freshman Zane Perez, 119; sophomore Zach Bainter, 125; junior Jeff Soderlund, 145 and senior Shane Stanley, 215.

Junior Aaron Husted, 140 and senior Jordan Durham, 171, each won third place. Senior Blake VanEaton qualified for the third place match at 152 pounds but defaulted due to illness and placed

Norton compiled a 28-12 wonloss record and a 12-4 pin ratio. "It was a very grueling week for

us," said coach Johnson. "We overcame an awful lot of sickness to win the two duals on Friday and the Panther Classic. Many of our wrestlers were not feeling 100 percent by any means.

"We dropped some matches that we normally would have won.

"All that said, I was pleased with our team performance. Scoring nearly 200 points where you only place four is tough to do."

The fourth quarter belonged to Norton as the Blue Jays outscored the Ringnecks 18-13. Eleven of Norton's fourth quarter points came from the free throw line.. Kats buried another three-point try and hit four free throws. Lewis hit a basket and charity. Cox and senior guard Brian Juenemann each hit three free throws and Engelbert hit a two-point basket.

'This was a good win for us because Hill City is a good team," said coach Reusink. "They are well coached and make you do things right or you pay.

"We played good defense the entire game and hit our free throws down the stretch. Our three-point shooting made them change defenses from a zone to a man-toman and that helped.'

Leading scorer for Norton was Kats, who continued to shoot very well. He hit 2 of 3 from long-range for 67 percent, 3 of 7 two-point shots for 43 percent and 5 of 10 overall for 50 percent. From the free throw line he was 4 of 6 for 67

percent and finished with 16

Lewis was the Blue Jays' only other double figure scorer. After failing to score in the first half, Lewis hit 10 points after intermission. He was 4 of 6 from the field for 67 percent and 2 of 8 from the free throw line for 25 percent.

Alex VanLoenen led Hill City with 12 points and David Gerstner added 11.

As a team, the Blue Jays rippled the nylons on 5 of 12 three-point attempts for an excellent 42 percent, swished 11 of 25 two-point tries for 44 percent and connected on 16 of 37 overall for 43 percent.
