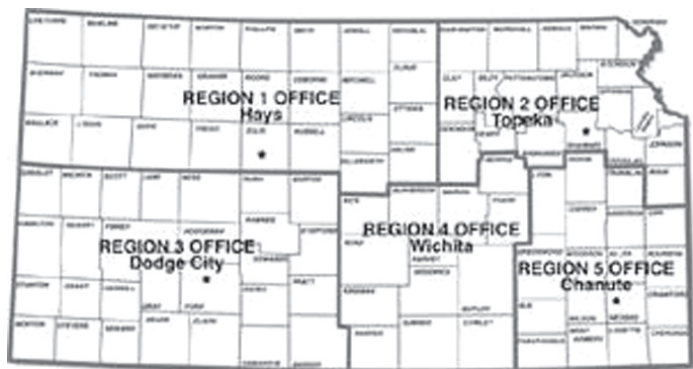

 "The number of birds available this fall should be better than last year and a much higher percentage will be juveniles," said the report.  
 "More juveniles and better cover conditions mean that birds will hold tighter and hunting should be much improved from last fall. Prospects will vary across the five administrative regions, with most of western Kansas offering much better hunting opportunities this fall while other regions will be similar or slightly worse than last year."
