## Wrestling coach welcomes roster of 28

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com Norton Community High School head wrestling coach Bill Johnson, who is beginning his 17th year as the Blue Jay mentor, has welcomed 28 wrestlers, including 11 lettermen, to the 2007-008 squad.

After winning the state championship the previous three years in a row, Norton placed third last year, missing a state championship by one and one-half points as Smith Center and Beloit tied for the title in one of the closest finishes ever.

Norton returns four state medalists from last year's team which compiled a 19-1 overall dual record, which included a perfect 8-0 dual record and 12th consecutive dual championship of the Mid-Continent League.

In addition, they won their fourth straight championship of the Hoxie Invitational, placed second in the Goodland Holiday Classic dual tournament, second in the Clay Center Invitational, won their fourth straight championship of the J.R Durham Invitational in Norton, entered the Emporia Dual Tournament for the first time and returned with a perfect 5-0 record, won the Mid-Continent League Tournament championship for the eighth consecutive year, won the Panther Classic in Phillipsburg for the fourth year in a row and won the Regional Tournament for the third year in a row.

Returning from that outstanding team are four state medalists. Senior Alex Thomas returns at heavyweight, where he placed third in the state last season.

"Our strengths this season will be in our returning state medalists and state qualifiers," said coach Johnson. "We look to have good depth from 103 to 171 pounds but will be thin in the upper weights again this season.

"A good group of freshmen have entered our program after having much success in the past. As always, these young men will have to prove themselves at the high school level. It is not out of the question that several of these freshmen could crack the varsity lineup."
