



League coaches pick 11 Norton players

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com Eleven members of second-year head coach Lucas Melvin's 2007 Norton Community High School football team have been honored as members of the Mid-Continent League All-League Team by vote of the league coaches.

The Blue Jays compiled an 8-3 record this season and lost only to ranked teams. They tied for second in the tough Mid-Continent League and won the District and Bi-District championships and placed runnerup in the Regional.

Five Norton players were first team selections. Zac Dreher, a 6-feet-2-inch, 185 pound junior, back and kick returner. He was for his play as a quarterback. He man, senior tackle, Smith Center; was the Blue Jays' leading tackler for the second year in a row from his linebacker position and was also a first team choice for the second straight season.

Zach Mannel, 5'10", 235 pound senior tackle, moved up from the second team defense last year to first team defense.

Senior defensive back Travis Ray was named first team defense. The 6'1", 180 pound Ray received honorable mention last season.

Todd Bolt, 5'9", 155 pound senior, was named first team defensive back after receiving honorable mention last season. Todd led Norton's defense with seven pass interceptions and was third high tackler.

Todd received a double first team honor since coaches also picked him on the first team as a punter. He punted 35 times for 1,146 yards and a 32.7 yard average.

Wes Georgeson, 6'4", 195 pound senior wide receiver, was chosen first team on offense after receiving honorable mention last season. Wes was Norton's leading on the second team offense and pass receiver with 31 catches for received honorable mention on 564 yards and an average of 18.2 yards per catch. He was third high on the team in all purpose yards.

Bolt also had a double honor on offense where he was chosen to the second team as both a running


the Blue Jay leader in all purpose yards. He gained 848 yards rushing on 136 attempts for 6.2 yards per carry and 16 touchdowns. He caught seven passes for 139 yards and one touchdown and averaged 12.6 yards per reception. He also returned 10 kickoffs for 190 yards and a 19 yard average and one touchdown and returned 10 punts for 219 yards and a 21.9 yard average and two touchdowns. His seven pass interceptions for 136 yards brought his total offense to 1,532 yards.

Preston Herman, a 6'3", 210 pound senior, was also honored twice. He was named to the second team as a center and second team as a defensive end. Preston was a second team selection on offense last year.

Senior tight end Jared Cox, who is 6'1", 175 pounds, also repeated as a second team choice from last season. Ray was also chosen to the second team offense as a wide receiver.

Brock Lauer, 5'11", 175 pound junior guard, was also selected defense as an end.

Logan Kats, 5'9", 160 pound senior, was named to the second team as a defensive back. He also received honorable mention for Smith Center; Taylor Dirks, senior

completed 65 of 131 passing attempts for 1,103 yards and eight touchdowns. He averaged 17 yards per completion. Kats also rushed for 171 yards for a total of 1,274 yards passing and rushing.


Terrell Lane, a 5'11", 200 pound freshman, was named to the second team on defense from his linebacker spot and received a double honorable mention honor for his running back play as well as kick returner performance on offense.

Terrell was second leading tackler for the Blue Jays, intercepted three passes and was second in all purpose yards with a total of 1,139 yards. He rushed for 755 yards on 134 tries for an average of 5.6 yards per carry. He scored seven touchdowns. He caught four passes for 67 yards and a 16.8 yard average and returned 10 kickoffs for 276 yards and a 27.6 yard average and one touchdown.

Alex Thomas, a 6', 270 pound senior, won honorable mention for his play as a defensive tackle.


