'Gold' opening for Blue Jay wrestlers

By DICK BOYD nortontelegram@nwkansas.com Coach Bill Johnson's Norton Community High School varsity wrestling team opened the 2007-'08 season on Saturday by winning their fifth straight championship of the Hoxie Invitational

Tournament. The Blue Jays ran away with the championship, outscoring second place Oakley by 82 points. Norton totaled 226 points, followed by Oakley, 144; Plainville, 111; Oberlin, 95; Hoxie, 74; Trego, 59; Holcomb, 58. Lakin was scheduled to compete but did not due to inclement weather conditions

in their area. Coach Johnson's wrestlers compiled an impressive wonloss record of 27-12 and had an exceptional 20-3 pin ratio. Every Norton wrestler placed in the tournament. Six of the Blue Jays won individual championships, two placed second, three finished third and three placed fourth.

Norton champions were: freshman Troy Bainter, 103; freshman Billy Broeckelman, 112; junior Zach Bainter, 135; senior Todd Bolt, 140; senior Jeff Soderlund, 152 and senior Alex Thomas,

Sophomore Connor Pfannen-Perez, 130, each placed second.

Winning third in their weight classes were: junior Matt Stanley, junior Jordan Bebb and sophomore Robert Derauf.

Placing fourth were freshman Landon Keiswetter, 119; senior Aaron Husted, 145 and sophomore Tyler Cook, 189.

Coach Johnson named Jeff Soderlund and Jordan Bebb "Co-Wrestlers of the Week".

Jeff Soderlund was seeded No.2 at 152. In the first round, he pinned Cody Stewart, Oakley, in 57 seconds, then pinned No.3 seed Kevin Chalmers, Holcomb, in 30 seconds of their semi-finals match. Jeff placed fourth in the state tournament last season and No.1 seed Gage Reichert, Oberlin, also placed fourth in a different weight class. The two met in the championship finals and Jeff dominated him, winning a 12-4 major decision and the gold medal.

Stewart placed third by pinning Chalmers in 51 seconds.

At 160, Matt Stanley was seeded No.3. He drew a first round bye, then lost a 9-7 decision to No.2 seed Clayton Rall, Hoxie. In the consolation bracket, he pinned No.4 seed Josh Plante, Plainville, in 1:35, then pinned Ace Manning, Oberlin, in 3:22 to place third.

No.1 seed Kelly Younkin, Oakley, shutout Rall 7-0 to win the championship.

Jordan Bebb was seeded No.4 at 171. He pinned Dayton Crist, Holcomb, in 52 seconds of the first period in their first round match, then lost a 5-4 decision in overtime to No.1 seed Quinn Aumiller, Hoxie. 
Marcusson won an 8-0 decision over Baker and pinned Dietz in 40 seconds to win the gold medal.


No.1 seed Aaron Racette, Oakley, won the championship by pinning Dirks in 53 seconds.


