The Blue Jay track and field athletes include 12 letter winners and 6 state competitors from a year ago on the girls team and 8 letter winners and 4 state competitors on the boys team.

Norton opened the track season on Monday in the Junior Varsity Track Meet in Smith Center. Results were not available at press time.

Varsity competition for Norton will begin on Friday with the annual Norton Invitational Track last season. Meet on the Jep Byrum Track at Travis Field.

Field events will begin at 3 p.m. and running events at 5 p.m. No preliminaries will be held and all events will be run as finals. All athletes may be entered.

In addition to Norton, competing teams will be from Colby, Goodland, Logan, Northern Valley, Phillipsburg and Smith Center high schools.

Plaques will be awarded to the first and second place teams in champion in the Mid-Continent both boys and girls divisions and League for the second straight medals will be awarded for the first three places in each event.

Assisting coach Jones again this season will be Dale Engelbert, Doug Reusink, Todd Fulton and Lucas Melvin.

Student managers are Lucy Gosselin and Bloss Jacobus, both juniors.

Coach Jones is a Logan native. A 1994 Logan High School graduate, he was the Class 1A state pole vault champion. He attended Fort Hays State University in Hays on a track scholarship and pole vaulted for the Tigers. He was an all-conference performer and graduated in December, 1998.

He was head track coach and assistant football coach at Fowler High School for three years before moving to Norton. He was a teacher and assistant football and track coach in Norton for four years before becoming head track coach last season.

"We are very excited about the number of young women and men who are on our team this year and thrilled with the levels of talent and desire that these athletes bring to our program," said coach the state meet.

Courtney LeClair is a three-year letter winner. She has been the Mid-Continent League champion in the 100 meter hurdles the past two seasons and was league champion in the 300 meter hurdles her sophomore season and placed second in the league in the event

LeClair was second in the regional meet in both the 100 and 300 meter hurdles to qualify for the state meet in both events for the second straight season. She placed eighth in the 100 meter hurdles in the state meet.

Laura Lee Baird, Hayli Bozarth, Amanda Delimont, Wiyanna Paxton, KaraJo Jones and Taylor Rossi are all two-year letter winners.

Baird was the 400 meter dash season last year. She also won the 800 meter run championship her freshman season and was second last year. She placed second in the 400 and 800 in the regional meet last year to qualify for the state meet for the second straight season

After placing second in the 400 meters and sixth in the 800 meters in the state meet her freshman year, Baird broke the Norton school record in placing third in 2:19.60 in the 800 meters and was fourth in the 400 meters in the state meet last season with a time of 58.40, which was less than a second from the Norton school record.

The previous Norton 800 meter record was 2:20.8 set by Susan Miller. The Norton 400 meter dash record of 58.1 is held by the former Renee Cox.

Bozarth was the Mid-Continent League shot put champion last season, placed second in the league in the discus and third in the javelin. She won the gold medal in the discus and placed second in the shot put event in the regional meet to qualify for both events in



Jared Cox is a three-year letterman. He placed sixth in the state meet in the 300 meter hurdles as a freshman. Last season he was league champion in the 300 meter hurdles and finished third in the 110 meter hurdles. He also placed third in the 110 meter hurdles and sixth in the 300 meter hurdles in the regional meet. In the state meet, he finished in eleventh place in the 110 meter hurdles.

Logan Kats is Norton's other three-year letterman. He is the only remaining member of the Blue Jays' 1600 meter relay team which won the league championship, placed third in the regional meet and fourth in the state meet. Wes Georgeson is a quality hurdler who placed fifth in the league meet last year in the 110 meter hurdles and fifth in the same event in the regional meet, just missing a place in the state meet. He made the trip to the state competition as a relay alternate. Zach Bainter was the Mid-Continent League champion last season in the 1600 meter run, placed fourth in the 800 meters in the league and is the only remaining member of the Blue Jays 3200 meter relay team which won the gold medal in the league. He placed fourth in the 1600 meter run in the regional meet and his 3200 meter relay team also qualified for the state meet with a second place finish. Bainter finished eleventh in the 1600 meter run in the state meet last season and his 3200 meter relay team won the state championship with a school record time of 8:07.57. Seniors Blake VanEaton, Logan Keiswetter and Jared Engelbert were the other members of the team. They broke the Blue Jay school record of 8:16.20 which was held by Brent Bohl, Kevin Hahn, Kirk Kasson and Mike Colip. The Blue Jay boys won the league championship last season, placed third in the regional meet and eighth in the state meet.
