Blue Jay girls track team still undefeat-

Coach Jason Jones' Norton Community High School girls track team remained undefeated for the season and his boys Blue Jays placed a solid third in the annual Goldsmith Relays on Friday in WaKeeney.

The Norton girls and boys set two meet records and a total of 16 personal records!

The Lady Jays had their biggest margin of victory yet this season, outscoring second place team Phillipsburg by 51.5 points. Norton tallied 116.5 points, compared to Phillipsburg, 65; Russell, 63; Oakley, 61; Thomas More Prep-Marian of Hays, 59; La Crosse, 56; Holcomb, 42; Plainville, 31; Victoria, 29; Leoti, 15; Trego, 11; Ness City, 10.5.

The Phillipsburg boys team won the championship with 99 points, followed by La Crosse, 91; Norton, 72; Holcomb, 63; Russell, 58; Victoria, 57; Ness City, 41; Thomas More Prep of Hays, 29; Leoti, 25; Oakley, 15; Plainville, 4; Trego, 4.

Girls

Norton junior Laura Lee Baird continued her dominance in the running events as she once again earned three gold medals and broke two meet records. She won the 1600 meter run in the meet record time of 5:24 and breezed to the gold in the 800 meter run in a record-breaking 2:20.96.

In the 4 x 400 meter relay, Baird and three teammates placed first with a time of 4:21.69. When Baird received the baton for the anchor lap, she was in third place but steadily gained on the two leaders and edged an Oakley runner at the tape to win by three hundredths of a second!

Running with her in the relay were senior Courtney LeClair, junior KaraJo Jones and freshman Dustyna Sprigg.

Norton's female hurdles specialist, LeClair won gold medals in both hurdles events! She was timed in 15.80 in the 100 meter hurdles and 49.72 in the 300 meter hurdles.

Junior Hayli Bozarth was dominant again in the field events and a bronze. She heaved the shot put 40'8" to break her own personal record and threw the discus 111'2". Bozarth also threw the javelin 106'8" to place third. Junior Taylor Rossi continued her winning streak in the pole vault by once again tying her personal record of 9'. KaraJo Jones was also a member of the 4 x 100 meter relay team which placed third in 52.53. Running with her were Courtney LeClair, sophomore Raven Brown and sophomore Hannah Waggoner. KaraJo also placed third in the 200 meter dash with a personal record time of 27.45 and fifth in the long jump with a leap
