PROFILE #1

"Health Profile & CBC" — \$40.00 Health Profile Contains:

ELECTROLYTES: (Sodium, potassium, chloride and total carbon dioxide). These are major indicators of kidney and hormonal functions. Electrolytes are essential for the body's acid-base balance and the operation of nerves and muscles, especially the heart.

KIDNEY FUNCTIONS: (BUN, creatinine). These indicators are used to monitor kidney function. LIVER FUNCTIONS: (Total albumin, globulin). These tests can be used in detecting and/or monitoring liver function damage, tissue damage or

ALKALINE PHOSPHATE: (Uric acid, calcium, phosphorus). Used for detection and monitoring of bone, tissue and parathyroid disease, such as arthritis, gout, bursitis and lupus.

GLUCOSE: This test is to measure blood sugar levels and is used to help diagnose/monitor diabetes mellitus

CHOLESTEROL: (Including HDL, LDL, VLDL, triglycerides and ratio of LDL/HDL). These are fats pro duced in the liver that combine with fatty oils in the blood stream. Cholesterol is further broken down and measured as HDL (good cholesterol) and LDL (bad cholesterol). The person who has higher levels of LDL is at greater risk of heart disease. Triglycer ides determine the level of simple fats in the blood CBC: (Complete blood count with differential). This is a series of tests of the blood that provides a tremendous amount of information about the he matologic system, immune response and many other organ systems.

PSA-This test detects an enlarged prostate, infected prostate and/or prostatic cancer. It can be used to evaluate disease progression and to moni-
