Blue Jays win opener in double-overtime

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com Coach Lucas Melvin's 2008 edition of the Norton Community High School football team established themselves as a never-saydie squad by continuing to come from behind to defeat longtime rival Phillipsburg 29-22 in double overtime in the season opener Friday night at Travis Field in Norton.

The fighting Blue Jays, who were outweighed by the Panthers, trailed the entire Mid-Continent League game until tying the contest at 22-all with 10:48 left in regulation and winning with a touchdown in the second overtime!

Fumbles, penalties and a few letdowns on defense caused them problems but they made up for it by continuing to gang tackle on defense and use imagination on offense.

"The key to the game was that we never quit; we played really hard," said coach Melvin. "We had adversity the whole game but kept playing hard and turned it around in the fourth quarter and overtimes.

"On defense, we had one or two plays where we didn't run to the ball and that cost us but most of the time we had people flying around to the ball.

"Phillipsburg has a tough, powerful team. Their new players impressed me. They have an opportunity to be pretty good. Their coach J.B. Covington is a

"I'm really proud of our players. We had a lot of young players step up; several were starting their first varsity game. Our special teams helped us, too."

Coach Melvin started the folsophomore Kaid McKenna, center; sophomore Luke Ninemire, right guard; junior Tyler Cook, right tackle; senior Zac Dreher, quarterback; senior Matt Stanley, fullback; sophomore Terrell Lane, tailback.

Norton's defensive starters were: Brock Lauer and sophomore Panthers on top 2-0. Dakota Dreher, ends; senior John Brad Nuzum, junior Zane Perez, Landon Hamel and Ashton Drap-

er, defensive backs. On Norton's second possession, the Blue Jays had the ball on their own 5-yard-line and Lane was tackled in the end zone for a safety, giving Phillipsburg a 2-0 lead after one quarter.

The Panthers padded their lead with a 4-yard touchdown run with 7:03 left in the half but Lane made a beautiful 90 yard touchdown run on the ensuing kickoff to make it a 9-7 game.

A fumbled punt reception gave Phillipsburg the ball on the Norton 5-yard-line and Phillipsburg's Dylan Frantz tallied from three yards out to put the Panthers ahead 16-7 with 1:18 left.

The never quit Blue Jays used a pass play from Pfanennstiel to Draper accompanied by a roughing the passer penalty to take the ball to the Phillipsburg 20. From there, Pfanennstiel hit Lane with a flat pass and he powered into the end zone with 18 seconds left. The extra point kick by J.D. Gall put Norton behind by just 16-14 at halftime.

The only score in the third quarter came when Ben Suchsland, Phillipsburg's 224 pound running back, ran 34 yards up the middle, yard loss! breaking several tackles on his way to the end zone to make it 22-14.

But the Blue Jays continued to battle in the fourth quarter. A Pfannenstiel to Stanley pass carried to the Panther 16. Then, Dreher picked up a Norton fumble and ran into the end zone. Pfanennstiel ran a keeper for the extra points and ran in untouched to tie the score at 22-all with 10:48 left in regulation.

Each team got the ball on the 10-yard line with four downs to score in the overtime. Neither team scored in the first extra period. Norton got the ball first in the second overtime. Lane scored from the 3-yard-line and Gall kicked the extra point to put

That left Phillipsburg with four tries from the 10 but the fired up Blue Jay defense drove them back to the 24 on their first three plays. On the fourth down play, quarterback Weston Coomes passed complete to 222 pound senior tight end Zach Wood over the middle and he headed for the end zone. But, he didn't make it, thanks to a vicious tackle by 145 pound Pfannenstiel!

First quarter

Lane kicked off for Norton and Trevor Smith returned the ball to the 27-yard-line. Hamel tackled Frantz after 4 yards, Dreher and Stanley tackled Derek Rowland after 2 yards. Franz made nothing; the Panthers punted.

Hamel made a fair catch on the Norton 29. Norton gained 5 yards on 3 plays and punted to the Panther 42. Nuzum tackled Franz after 6 yards and Lauer and Dreher dropped Colin Kirchhoff for a 2 yard loss. Second quarter

Perez gained 2 yards before Lane punted to the Norton 49. Rowland lost 1 yard but Frantz ran around left end for a first down on the 32 before Lane tackled him. A whole host of Norton players limited a Phillipsburg back to 2 yards before Lauer tackled Frantz after a short gain. The next down, however, the Panthers got a first down on the 15. Suchsland bulled for 2 hard yards again the stubborn Blue Jay defense, then Dreher blitzed to drop Coomes for a 5

Frantz picked up 7 on the next down before Perez tackled him, then Coomes passed to Thompson for a first down on the 5 by

An illegal procedure penalty cost Phillipsburg 5 yards but Frantz got 4 of it back. The next down, Smith took a pitch from Coomes and ran around right end into the end zone. Wood kicked the extra point, extending the visitors' lead to 9-0 with 7:03 left.

Lane took the Panther kickoff, followed a wall of Norton blockers, then set off on his own and outran the entire Phillipsburg team 90 yards to the end zone! Gall kicked the extra point and it was

9-7 with 6:50 left. Frantz returned Lane's kickoff to the 30. On first down, the gang tackling Norton defense dropped Rowland for no gain as Dreher, Lauer and Stanley piled on top of him. Rowland got the call again and lost 1 this time. The Panthers decided to go airborne and were successful as Coomes connected with Chance Keiswetter for a first down on the Phillipsburg 49. A flat pass to Frantz netted 1 but Frantz picked up 11 yards the next down for a first down on the Norton 39.

Frantz got the call again but a big time hit by Dreher dropped him after 1 yard. Frantz ran for 4 yards but Nuzum blitzed and sacked Coomes for an 11 yard loss. The Panthers punted and got a big break when the Norton receiver fumbled and they recovered on the Blue Jay 5-yard-line.

Frantz got nothing on first down as Lane and Dreher were there to meet him. Next, Coomes passed and Norton was penalized half the distance for pass interference. The next play, Frantz scored up the middle, Wood kicked the extra point and Phillipsburg led 16-7 with 1:18 left in the half.

The determined Blue Jays came fighting back and took to the air after Hamel returned the kickoff to the Norton 27. Lane bulled for 1 yard, then Pfannenstiel and Draper connected on a beautiful pass play to the Phillipsburg 34. Aroughing the passer penalty took the ball to the 20. Next, Pfannenstiel threw a flat pass to Lane, who eluded several would-be tacklers on his way into the end zone. Gall kicked the extra point, making it 16-14 with just 18 seconds left.

After Gall's kickoff, Phillipsburg got one play and it was halftime.

Third quarter

The second half did not start well for the Blue Jays but they did not give in to adversity. Lane returned the kickoff to the 28 but gained nothing on first down and had a bad exchange with Pfannenstiel on second down. The Panthers recovered the fumbled ball on the Norton 22-yard-line.

The Blue Jay defense was equal to the occasion, however, stopping Frantz for no gain, limiting him to two yards and dropping Thomas Rachow after 1 yard. On fourth down, Stanley and Lauer forced Smith outside, Nuzum turned him in and a whole host of Blue Jays

The Blue Jays were unable to Stanley got 3 up the middle on first down. Lane punted to the Phillipsburg 49.

Kirchhoff gained 4 and Frantz got nothing but Coomes went back to pass and was run out of the pocket. He picked up a first down on the Norton 38.

After Frantz gained 4 yards, the 224 pound Suchsland made the best run of the game for Phillipsburg as he broke several tackles en route to a touchdown. The extra point kick was wide but the Panthers were on top 22-14 with 5:15 left in the quarter.

Norton was determined to get another touchdown and moved downfield quickly after Lane returned the kickoff to the 34. Lane carried three straight times for a first down on the Norton 46. Next, Lane threw a tailback pass to Hamel. It was incomplete but the Panthers were penalized for pass interference. The ball was moved to the Phillipsburg 39.

Stanley bulled ahead for 9, then Perez gained a first down with a 4 yard carry around right end. Pfannenstiel lost 3 yards but made up for it with a 5 yard pass to Dreher. Perez made a good run over the left side of the line but fumbled and the Panthers recovered on the 12.

Frantz gained 3 but Coomes lost 3 as the quarter ended, 22-14.

Fourth quarter

A long Phillipsburg pass was incomplete and they punted to their 40. Pfannenstiel passed to Stanley and he made a great catch before being tackled on the 16. Nuzum plunged for 1 yard. On second down, a Norton fumble on the 2 was picked up by Dreher who sprinted into the end zone for a Blue Jay touchdown!.

Pfannenstiel ran the keeper around left end and ran untouched for 2 extra points and a 22-all score with 10:48 left in regulation. Gall's kickoff was returned to

the 34. Kirchhoff gained 5 yards before Hamel and Stanley tackled him. Lane and Stanley stopped Kirchhoff after 2 more but Frantz

got a first down up the middle on the 45. Dreher blitzed and tackled Kirchhoff for a minus 1. Lane and company tackled Suchsland for no gain. Hamel and Nuzum dropped Wood for no gain after he caught a flat pass. Phillipsburg punted to the Norton 29 with 7:18 left.

After two running plays went nowhere, Pfannenstiel passed to Dreher for a first down on the Norton 41. A run and two unsuccessful passes later, Lane punted to the Phillipsburg 18. The fighting Jay defense was again equal to the occasion and held the Panthers to three-and-out. They punted to the Norton 27.

Lane gained 6 yards on two carries, then Phillipsburg was offsides and the Jays got a first down on the 40. The Panthers held this time, however, and Lane punted to the Panther 24. Coomes was sacked and Rowland was stopped for no gain as the whistle sounded to end regulation at 22-all.

First overtime

Norton won the coin toss and took defense to start the extra period on the 10-yard-line. Phillipsburg tried to sweep left end but fumbled and recovered on the 13. Nuzum broke up a pass in the end zone. Norton was called for pass interference and the Panthers got the ball half the distance to the goal with a first down on the 7. Stanley and Van Dorn tackled Frantz for a 1 yard loss. Phillipsburg was penalized for an illegal substitution. A pass was incomplete in the end zone, Rowland ran to the 4 and, on fourth down, Lane and Hamel broke up a pass in the end zone.

Norton was awarded the ball on the 10-yard-line and the Jays also were denied the end zone. Lane gained 3 but Stanley lost 2. A flat pass to Stanley gained back to the 7 and a Gall field goal try missed, a 42 yard average. He punted 6

Phillipsburg won the coin flip and took defense. Lane gained 2 around left end. Stanley plunged for 2 and Phillipsburg was penalized half the distance on a face mask penalty. Lane got the call again, ran into a crowd over right tackle and emerged standing in the end zone! Gall kicked the extra point and Norton led 29-22, the Blue Jays first lead of the game!

The ball then went to Phillipsburg for four tries from the 10. On first down, an illegal procedure penalty set them back to the 15. Coomes fumbled and recovered the ball on the 20. On second down, Dreher and company sacked Coomes on the 24. Coomes got a third down pass off but Hamel knocked it down in the end zone. On fourth and 24, the Panthers had one final chance to salvage a victory after leading the entire game.

Coomes completed a pass this ime. It went to 2 tight end Wood over the middle Friday to play Oberlin in a 7 p.m. and he started for the goalline. He didn't make it, however, as 145 pound junior defensive back Pfannenstiel hit him low, knocked his legs out from under him and he fell to the turf on the 3, ending the game with a thrilling 29-22 victory for the "fighting Blue Jays"!
