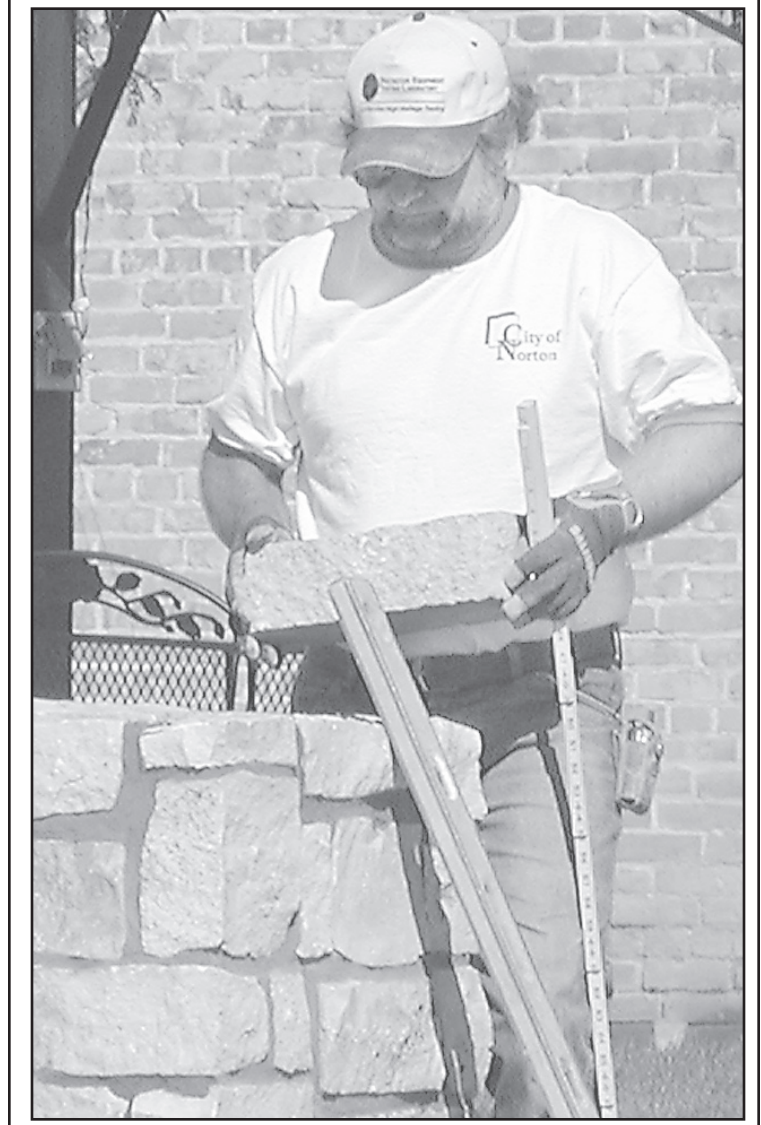

 also not right to cut staff to keep the shop open."
 Atwood will also be eliminating one full-time position and one part-time position. Oakley will see a redefining of services with several staff positions being eliminated and office space being reduced. Several staff positions in Hays have been removed, and their 1-800 Customer Connection

system has been restructured to reduce costs. "These unfortunate yet necessary changes are examples of the erosion caused by the lack of full funding for the community service network across the State of Kansas for persons with developmental disabilities. Such changes paint an undeniable picture for State Legislators that full funding for these essential services must be top priority in 2009," said President Michaud.
