Colby board hears possible withdrawal from league

Gabel said he took no pleasure in breaking the news to the people at the meeting.

"It tears me up to break out of the NWKL," said Gabel, a longtime coach in the league. reality he said, it might include are able to put together softball, they are doing right and what Colby, Ulysses, Cimarron, Scott

City, Lakin, Holcomb, Hugoton and Goodland.

"These schools have enrollments, attendance, and programs that are similar to ours," he said.

The school boards from the districts that would be in the new league will decide if they are going to create this new league on Jan. 22.

The reason Colby may be leaving the Northwest Kansas League is because of the enrollment decline in many of the leagues schools.

Today Colby and Goodland are the only Class 4A schools in the league, Gabel said. They
