

Good state show for Norton Jay runners

The Norton Community High School girls cross country team, led by a third place finish by senior Laura Lee Baird, placed fifth in the Class 3A State Cross Country Meet on Saturday in Wamego and Blue Jay senior Zach Bainter also placed third in the boys division.

The Lady Jays ran away with the regional championship the week before to qualify as a team for the state meet for only the second time in school history. Last year's team, which placed sixth in the state meet, was the first to make the state competition as a team.

The Norton boys placed fourth in the regional and missed qualifying for the state meet by two points. Bainter was the only Norton boy to qualify for the state meet and he did it for the fourth straight year!

The Belle Plaine girls won the state championship this year with 50 points, followed by Riley County, 52; Southeast of Saline, 115; Remington, 120; Norton, 141; Kansas City Christian, 187; Rossville, 188; Northern Heights, 191; Mission Valley, 223; Medicine Lodge, 227; Lakin, 270; Burlington, 293.

The top three boys teams were Holcomb, 72; Southeast of Saline, 88; Hutchinson Trinity, 104.

outstanding prep cross country career with her third place finish in the 2.5 mile race in 16:02.24.

Lady Jay senior KaraJo Jones placed 19th in 16:53.61. The top 20 placers received medals during the awards ceremony and the top three teams received plaques.

Freshman Abby Bainter finished 27th in 17:12.53. Senior Taylor Rossi placed 73rd in 18:34.71. Completing Norton's five-girl team finish was Taylor's sophomore sister Kaylen Rossi with a clocking of 18:42.10 for 74th place.

Also running for Norton and their times and places were sophomore Dustyna Sprigg, 19:55.40, 88th and junior Amanda Ray, 21:42.82, 96th.

Others in the top 10 in addition to Baird were: Amanda Callaway, Belle Plaine, first, 15:32.55; Kylie Graves, Rossville, second, 15:48.12; Kimberly Smith, Northern Heights, fourth, 16:07.72; Gentry Linscott, Atchison County, fifth, 16:12.19; Morgan Tribble, Remington, sixth, 16:25.76; Taylor Scott, Belle Plaine, seventh, 16:30.22; Alissa Ruggle, Riley County, eighth, 16:34.17; Shelby Smithhisler, Belle Plaine, ninth, 16:38.53; Emily Collins, Riley County, tenth, 16:42.27.

"The girls field was very tough," said coach Hehn. "It was much stronger than last year.

Northern Valley sophomore Kayla Field had another outstanding performance in the Class 1A State Cross Country Meet on Saturday in Wamego with a 13th place finish in 17:17.27.

The top 20 individual runners received medals.

Field's time beat the 17:20.67 which placed her 18th last year as a freshman. In this year's regional she ran 17:49 to place sixth.

"Kayla ran very well," said Northern Valley head coach Laryl Rous.

"She had shin problems early in the season and missed two weeks of practice. She worked out of that

and built back up during the rest of the season.

"She had lots of support from our other cross country runners Kynzie Stevens and Stanton Nelson and the Norton girls were very friendly and an inspiration to her.

"She works hard and it's good to see her finish the season so strong and beat her previous times."

Huskies manhandled by Wildcats

The trip to Sharon Springs last Thursday evening for the Northern Valley football Huskies didn't come out as hoped with the Wildcats taking a lopsided 60-16 victory.

The Huskies scored their 16 points in the third quarter when Dusty Eagleburger connected with Eric Woodside on an 8-yard pass and Eagleburger then adding the PAT, and Ethan Hays returning a kick for a 78-yard TD and Dusty Eagleburger again adding the PAT.

The Wildcats scored 8 points in the first quarter, 24 in the second, 22 in the third and 6 in the fourth.

Northern Valley rushed for 43 yards on 37 carries vs. 210 yards on 37 carries for the Wildcats.

Northern Valley collected 44 yards on 6 of 15 passing vs. 87 yards for the Wildcats on 7 of 10 passing.

Northern Valley was penalized 6 times for 40 yards and the Wildcats 11 times for 107 yards.

Northern Valley punted 6 times for 156 yards (26.0 average) vs. 2 for 81 yards for the Wildcats (40.5 average).

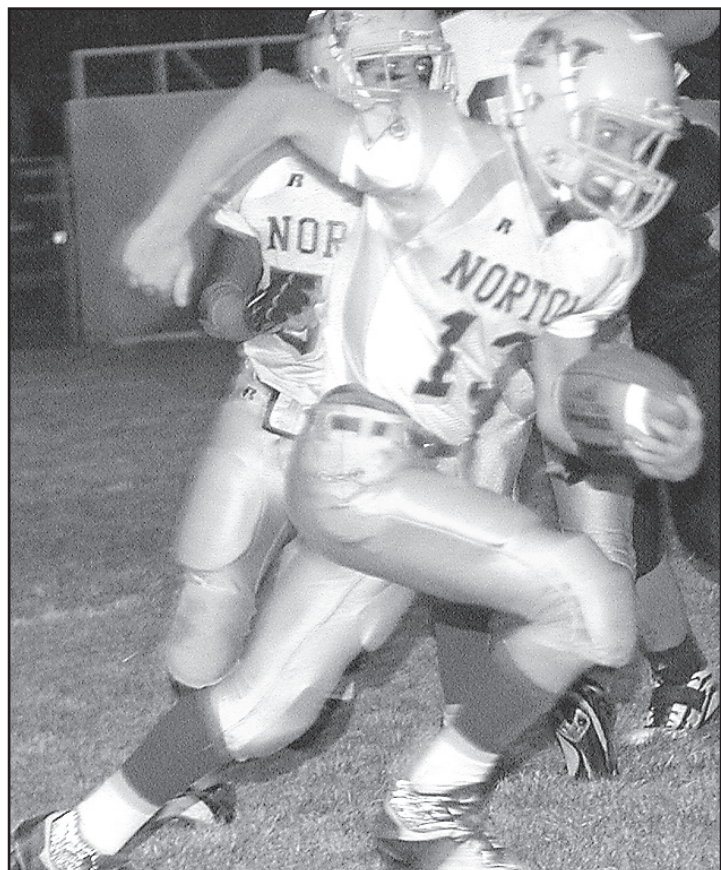
