Despite penalties, Blue Jays prevail by 21

Coach Lucas Melvin's Norton Community High School football team scored five touchdowns, championship!

penalties hampered Norton's offensive production. In the District win over Goodland, Norton had 117 yards in penalties and, in the win over previously unbeaten Scott City, the Blue Jays recorded 89 yards in penalties.

had 90 yards in penalties. One touchdown was called back for holding and another for an illegal block, both in the scoreless second half.

Meanwhile, the Norton defense limited Lakin to 3.1 yards per carry and 43 percent pass completions. Lakin had just seven first downs in the game, four in the first half and three in the second. The Bronc offense was also frustrated by one pass interception and one fumble recovery by the aggressive Blue Jay defense. Lakin never seriously threatened to score.

Norton had the pigskin on three occasions in the second quarter and scored on all three. The Blue Jays drove 64 yards to score their first touchdown with 6:31 left in the period. Senior fullback Matt Stanley got the scoring honors as he plunged 1 yard into the end

With 3:15 remaining, sophomore tailback Terrell Lane ran 45 yards for the second Blue Jay touchdown. Lane scored again, this time from 14 yards out with 44 seconds on the scoreboard clock. Sophomore kicker Caleb Laughlin split the uprights on all three extra point kicks and the Jays led 21-0 at intermission.

Lane had another great rushing game, carrying the ball 30 times for 203 yards and a 6.8 yards per carry average.

Coach's comments
