# Eight letter winners on Jay ladies' roster

In addition to winning the Class 3A substate tournament and advancing to the state tournament in Hutchinson, Norton placed second in the annual Topside Tip-Off Tournament in Goodland, third in the annual Mid-Continent League Tournament and tied for fourth with Ellis in the league race.

The Lady Jays were impressive in defeating No.1 seed Sacred Heart of Salina 40-35 to win the substate championship. Norton was seeded No.6 in the state tournament and played No.3 seed Wichita Collegiate on opening day. Both teams hit 15 field goals and 9 free throws but three-point shots by Collegiate made the difference and gave Collegiate

a 45-39 win and ended Norton's 5'5", freshmen. season at 16-8.

It was the Norton girls first state Bozarth were both first team all-league selections last season. Baird was also a first team choice as a sophomore and received honorable mention by vote of the team coaches her freshman season.

Baird was leading scorer last season with 16.3 points per contest and led the Lady Jays in free throws by hitting 74.8 percent of her charities.

Baird was also steals leader with 73. Bozarth was right behind Baird in scoring with a 16 points per game average and was the Lady Jays' leading rebounder with 143, or 6 per contest. Bozarth was also the most accurate field goal shooter among the starters with a 56.9 percent average and second high in free throw accuracy with a 69.9 percent average.

KaraJo Jones was second high rebounder with 107, or 4.5 per game. Taylor Rossi was assists leader with 82 and second in steals
