Dec. 11-12-13 in Goodland. In the opener on Thursday, Norton lost 73-35 to eventual tournament champion Ottawa. In the consolation bracket on Friday, the Blue Jays lost 52-40 to Burlington, Colo. and they defeated Weskan

61-44 on Saturday. Ottawa defeated McCook 57-47 to win the championship. Sharon Springs outscored Goodland 73-45 to place third and Wray, Colo. defeated Burlington 48-43 for fifth.

Norton was outscored 22-11 in the first quarter. The Blue Jays' points came on baskets by Ashton Draper, Luke Ninemire, Landon Hamel, J.D. Gall and Zac Dreher and a free throw by Dreher.

Norton scored 9 points in the second quarter with baskets by Draper, Hamel, Zac Dreher and Ninemire and a free throw by Ninemire. Ottawa tallied 23 points to take a 45-20 half-time advan-
