# Blue Jay ladies finish third in tournament

After defeating McCook 39-33 in the opener on Thursday, the Lady Jays lost 57-50 to Wray, Colo. on Friday and defeated Weskan 49-41 on Saturday to fin-

The Norton girls got a slow start in the win over McCook on opening day of the tournament. The Lady Jays trailed 9-8 after one quarter which saw Lacey Wallingford hit two baskets, Ashlie Stewart one and Laura Lee Baird hit two free throws.

Wallingford was leading scorer for Norton with 14 points on 5 of 9 field goals for 55 percent accuracy and 4 of 8 free throws for 50 percent.

As a team, Norton hit just 1 of 15 three-point attempts for 6 percent, 15 of 34 two-point tries for 44 percent and 16 of 49 overall for 33 percent.

Norton hit 6 of 12 free throws for 50 percent while McCook tallied on 11 of 24 charities for 46 percent.

Norton grabbed 15 offensive and 22 defensive rebounds for 37 total compared to McCook's 13 offensive and 16 defensive caroms for 29 total.

Wallingford got a double-double with 14 rebounds, followed by Roy, Stewart, 6 each; Jones, 5; Baird, 4; Taylor Rossi, Ray, 1

In the third place game of the tournament, Norton jumped out to a 17-10 lead in the first quarter. Taylor Rossi led the way with three two-point baskets and a trey, Laura Lee Baird buried two shots from beyond the arc and Amanda Ray hit a two-point basket.

The second quarter was pretty even with Weskan scoring 12 points and Norton 11 to make it a 28-22 game. Baird hit a two and a three-point basket and two charities and Jones and Ray each added a basket.
