


The Class 3-2-1A State Wrestling Tournament will be held Friday and Saturday in Gross Memorial Coliseum at Fort Hays State University, Hays.

The first round will begin at 10 a.m. and will be followed by the second round championship quarterfinals at 1:30 p.m.

The second session will begin at 3:30 p.m. with the first round consolation on two mats and will be followed Stanley is now 23-13 for the season. by the championship semifinals on two mats. The championship semifinals will start immediately following the tion but not earlier than 4:30 p.m. The third session will be held Saturday, beginning at 9 a.m. with the consolation cross bracketing. Consolation quarterfinals will begin at 10:45 a.m., followed by consolation semifinals at 12:15 p.m. Fifth place matches will be wrestled on one mat at 1:45 p.m. and will be followed by the consolation finals on one mat at 2:30 p.m. The championship session will begin at 4:15 p.m. with the Parade of Champions. The championship finals will be wrestled on one mat, beginning at 4:30 p.m. An all day admission ticket for Friday or Saturday will cost \$10 for adults and \$6 for students kindergarten through 12th grade. Evening session only tickets on Friday or Saturday will cost \$6 for adults and \$5 for students
