Council votes to buy sludge truck

The Norton City Council, at its meeting last Wednesday, approved a motion to buy a 1994 International Sludge Truck. City Administrator Rob Lawson said the truck would allow crews to haul sludge in any weather, and he

said the truck would involve fewer

crew members working. The truck, he said, will cost \$69,500, but the council will be reimbursed by the Kansas Department of Health and Education's state revolving fund. The Kansas Department of Health and Environment approved Mr. Lawson's loan application prior to the coun-

cil meeting. The truck is located in Longview, Texas.

In other business:

• Mr. Lawson set a bid opening tower painting. The Kansas Department of Health and Environ-


