# Blue Jay football opens at Phillipsburg

**By DICK BOYD** nortontelegram@nwkansas.com Coach Lucas Melvin's Norton Community High School football team will take the field on Friday night to open the 2009 season with a 7 p.m. Mid-Continent League game at Phillipsburg.

In his fourth year as the head coach of the Blue Jays, coach Melvin expects another tough game with the Panthers. For the second straight season, the longtime rivals open the season playing each other. Last year's game was played in Norton and was typical of contests between Norton and Phillipsburg.

The Blue Jays were outweighed by the Panthers and trailed the entire game until tying the contest at 22-all with 10:48 left in regulation. The clock ran out with the score still knotted. Neither team scored in the first overtime period but Norton tallied a touchdown in the second extra period for the 29-22 victory!

"We've seen progress in our team from week one to week two but we expect another tough season opener from Phillipsburg," said coach Melvin.

"They will be good again and their coach J.B. Covington will have them ready to play.

After shutting out Osborne 40-0 Blue Jays returned home to host the unbeaten St. Francis eleven, a Smith Center clone. Norton scored through the air and on the ground to hand the Indians a 36-16 defeat!

Next, Norton traveled to Ellis for the second straight year. It was a defensive struggle. Neither team gained many yards but both teams had scoring opportunities. The Railroaders capitalized and the Blue Jays did not in a 20-0 loss.


