### **Booster meeting** scheduled Wed.



# Planning begins for a new clinic

ebradley@kansas.com Planning is underway for a new multimillion dollar doctors' clinic in Norton, which will provide increased space and more accessibility to its patients.

"We're looking at developing plans to build a new clinic," said Rich Miller,

hospital director.

The new clinic is expected to cost \$2.5 million. Miller said they will do everything they can to stay below the estimate. He had hoped to keep the project cost below \$2.2 million.

Financing has not been secured yet, although Amy Griffey, director of plan-

ning and development, said they will be looking at grants as well as low-interest loans.

The new clinic will be larger with seven offices, 17 exam rooms and two procedure rooms. Miller said there will be a covered walkway at the main entrance and parking will be on one level.

Griffey said there will be more accessibility for handicapped and limited mobility patients.

"The hospital is doing everything it can to meet the needs of limited accessibility," she said.

Miller said the clinic will be located on
