

Girls ‘played hard’ in MCL tournament

The Norton Community High School girls varsity volleyball team played hard but came away with just a 2-2 record in the Mid-Continent League Tournament, most of which was played on Saturday in Hill City.

On Thursday, the Lady Jays had to play Plainville for the right to get into pool play and they defeated the Lady Cardinals 25-21, 25-20.

On Saturday morning, they lost to Phillipsburg 11-25, 6-25, lost to Trego Community 12-25, 20-25 and defeated Ellis 25-23, 26-24.

Plainville
“I was very proud of how our girls came out ready to play against Plainville,” said Norton head volleyball coach Peggy Cox. “We have made great strides in our focus and commitment the last couple of weeks and it shows in our play.”

“Our Lady Jays are playing as a team and the confidence level has risen.”

Norton is seeded No.7 with a 7-19 record and will play No.2 seed Smith Center (32-5) at 3 p.m.

No.1 seed Phillipsburg (34-2) received a first round bye. No.4 seed Thomas More Prep-Marian (20-11) will play No.5 Goodland (17-16) and the winner will play Phillipsburg in the semi-finals.

No.3 Minneapolis (27-9) will play No.6 Beloit (14-18) in the other first round match and the winner will play the winner of the Norton-Smith Center match in the semi-finals.

Semi-finals winners will play for the championship and a berth in the state tournament.
