Grads play in senior bowl

The South kicked off to start the game. After several plays, they recovered a fumble, could not advance and kicked a field goal with 1:55 left in the first quarter. Their 3-0 lead held up through the period.

The North got a drive going in the second quarter but it was stopped by a South pass interception deep in their territory. The hard-hitting North defense caused a South fumble and the North recovered in the end zone for the only touchdown of the contest, giving them a 6-3 lead with 6:16 left in the first half. The point after try was no good.

Neither team was able to move the ball prior to halftime and the North's 6-3 lead stood at intermission.

The North kicked off to start the second half. After one South first down, the North recovered a fumble at mid-field. After an incomplete pass, the North fumbled and the South recovered. The North held and the South tried a field goal which split the uprights to tie the score at 6-all with 2:56 left in the third quarter.
