Track and Field meet celebrates 100 years

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com The Kansas State Track & Field Championships, the largest high school track and field meet in the nation, is always special for athletes and spectators alike but this year it was extra special because it was the 100th anniversary of the event.

The centennial meet called for a celebration and the Kansas State High School Activities Association rolled out the red carpet to honor all former state champions the past 100 years.

On Thursday, May 27, the night before Friday and Saturday competition in Cessna Stadium at Wichita State University in Wichita, the public was invited to a memorabilia display of photos and other items from past state meets, all categorized by decades.

In addition, a program was held during which former Kansas Olympians and NCAA champions were introduced and interviewed about their accomplishments.

Champions were also recognized during Friday and Saturday's competition when they presented medals to the medalists in each event.

On Saturday afternoon, time was alloted for all former state champions, Olympic and NCAA champions from Kansas and head coaches of state championship teams to walk, separated by decades, a Centennial Victory Lap around the 400 meter track at Cessna Stadium.

The top four athletes in every event in the regional track meets the week before qualified to compete at the state level and each received a special centennial medallion.

Norton first state champion team

Norton Community High School received some extra attention since the Blue Jays were the champions of the first State Track & Field Meet held in Emporia in 1911 and also won the state championship in 1915.

Marion won the 1912 state championship, Wichita was state champion in 1913 and 1914 and Topeka won the state championship in 1916.

In 1911, the top two finishers in each event in the meets in the six congressional districts qualified for the state meet. Norton hosted the Sixth District Meet and won that championship as well.

"The ampitheatre at Elmwood Park was filled to the brim with hopeful, cheering rooters," reported the yearbook on the District Meet.

"Norton's Lyman Arnold, by far the star man, took first in four events and second in two, making 26 of Norton's 49 points. He won the 220 yard dash, 220 yard hurdles, 120 yard hurdles and shot put and took second in the discus and 100 yard dash.

"The beautiful silver loving cup, presented by the Commercial Club of Norton and the best cup of the kind in the state, was gloriously won by our boys. Norton

received the honor nobly and Bullock, Colleen Strayer, LaNell respectably and, in our rejoicing, Cox, Renee Cox, 4:05.6. we accept the victory virtuously and without boasting."

Phillipsburg placed second to Norton with 16 points.

The Norton Telegram of April 19, 1911 had a long article prior to the District Meet to drum up enthusiasm from local residents. "It will be one round of gaiety for the people of Norton, the surrounding country and also the vast army of visitors who will be here on that day," said the writer.

The festivities were to begin with "a delicious chicken dinner hurdles, 27.0, shot put, 43'1"; Bob the proceeds of which will be used to send girls to the national Y.W conference at Cascade Colo.

"The stores will be closed during the meet thus giving everybody a chance to attend. Our boys will win because N.C.H.S. is in a winning mood. It can't be otherwise. Just come out and watch them do it.

"Having spent the day in this jump, 22'2.25"; Jeremy Hawks, manner you will be ready for the evening program. At the Auditorium the Senior class will present "The Kingdom of Hearts Contest", the greatest extravagance of the season."

In the 1911 State Track Meet in Emporia, Norton tallied 20 points to win the championship. Arnold continued to compete well, winning gold medals in the 220 yard dash and 220 yard hurdles. Norton also won the mile relay in a time of 3:44.2. In the story in the Norton Telegram following the state victory, the writer closed by saying, "The last quarter mile of the mile relay in which Arnold participated was the most spectacular feature of the day."

The 1915 State Track Meet was held in Manhattan. Norton's Joe Casey, Roy Wynn and Robert Schultz were the stars for Norton. Casey was high scoring man for Norton and second high scoring man for the meet. Casey won the shot put and low hurdles and was third in the high hurdles. Schultz won the discus. Wynn took third in the discus and the shot put, according to the yearbook.

"The boys brought home a beautiful loving cup which was given to the winning team," said the yearbook.
