Former Norton athlete competes in college

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com Hayli Bozarth, a former track, basketball and volleyball star at Norton Community High School, has completed her freshman year of track and field competition at Iowa State University, Ames, Iowa, with an outstanding performance in the USA Junior National Championships in Des Moines, Iowa.

Hayli qualified for the national meet for athletes 19 years of age or younger with the 12th best distance in the shot put.

She surpassed that ranking with a tenth place finish by heaving the iron ball 46'.5", a personal best for the outdoor season.

Hayli also finished her first indoor season with a personal best 47'7" in the shot put at the NCAA Qualifying Meet hosted by Iowa State University.

Hayli's indoor success transferred to her first outdoor season with personal records of 140'8" in the discus, 152'2" in the hammer throw and 45'9" in the shot prior to the Junior National Championships.

"From the moment that Hayli Bozarth stepped on campus, she displayed a unique mindset and determination to have a great freshman year," said C. Grant Wall, assistant track and field coach at Iowa State.

"Most freshmen collegiate throwers are not ready for the demands on and off the track of the Collegiate Track and Field season.

"Hayli worked from day one to put herself in a position to help her team and qualify for the Junior National Championships.

"Through the indoor season, she continually showed improvement and maturity as each meet came and went.

"Her mark of 53'6.5" in the weight throw, which she picked up for the first time this year, was a great start to her collegiate career in the event and she also set a personal best indoors in the shot put.

"Then, she finished her freshman year with a bang by setting outdoor personal records in the discus, hammer and shot.

"I am looking forward to the continued success Hayli Bozarth will have at Iowa State and on the national scene."

Hayli was a state track medalist all four years in high school. Her senior year, she won the gold medal in both the shot and discus and placed fifth in the javelin, just a few inches out of third.

Hayli is the Norton Community High School record holder in the shot and discus. She broke the shot put record with a heave of 45'5.5" in the league meet in Plainville her senior season and the discus record with a throw of 143'4" in the Russell Relays in 2008.

She is also a former all-Mid-Continent League performer in both volleyball and basketball.

Hayli is the daughter of Marla and Curt Bozarth. Her grandparents are Deloros and Bozie Bozarth and the late Rose and Leo Uhrich.
